
Lake Cargelligos' beauty and tranquility make it a perfect place to relax. Close to the Newell Highway, Mid Western Highway and the Kidman Way, Lake Cargelligo has something for everyone to enjoy.

THINGS TO SEE AND DO

- Stop, rest and soak up the natural beauty of Lake Cargelligo and its surrounds. There are a variety of camping areas available or stay in our beautifully appointed Lake View Caravan Park overlooking the Lake.
- Lake Cargelligo, the showpiece of the largest natural inland lake system in NSW having a volume of 36,000 mega litres, a surface area of 1,440 hectares and an average depth of 3.7 metres. Lake Cargelligo is the perfect place for recreation of all kinds including water skiing, fishing, canoeing, swimming, camping and much more.
- Lake Cargelligo is the ideal environment for bird watching with part
 of the Lake being classified as a bird sanctuary. There are several bird,
 watching locations near Lake Cargelligo including Curlew Water, Round
 Hill Reserve, Yelkin State Forest and Nombinnie Reserve in Mallee country
 which support a variety of rare and threatened species. Lake Cargelligo
 also has two bird hides found at the Sewerage Treatment Works,
 Blackers Rd, and at Nilsson's Rd. A bird guide and binoculars can be hired
 at the Lake Cargelligo Tourist Information Centre.
- Walk or cycle around the Lake on the bike path, viewing heritage signs with interesting historical information about the town, along the path, throughout the town and along the railway line.
- **Fishing** is another exciting activity at Lake Cargelligo and on the nearby Lachlan River. Visitors can purchase a fishing license at the local Canada Street Fuel at 108 Canada Street, at Orr's Gifts and Sports at 16 Foster Street or at Lake Building Supplies, 49 Reef Street.



- The Lake Cargelligo Museum is located in Holt Street, Lake Cargelligo and is a community owned and operated museum which houses a large collection of rural machinery, and Aboriginal and early colonial relics relevant to our local history. Entry fee is \$10 dollars for adults and \$5 dollars for children 5- 16 years of age, under 5 years free. To make a booking, please phone 6898 1384 or 6898 1051. The Lake Cargelligo Museum is also home to a unique display of working draught horses on the June Long Weekend Museum Open Day or by appointment for large groups so please ask.
- See how things used to be done on the land in years past with Jan and Steve Johnson's Working Draught Horse Museum located at McInnes Street Lake Cargelligo. Bookings are essential so please phone 6898 1384 or 0429 981 384 in advance to ensure the horses are ready for your visit. Deadmans Point at Lake Cargelligo is the location of several
- Aboriginal freshwater shell middens. Shell middens were formed by the accumulation of shells by Aboriginal people collecting, cooking and eating fresh water mussels over a long period of time
- An Aboriginal quarry or Ochre Pits containing rich yellow and red
 ochres can still be found at Lake Cargelligo on the lake's edge known as
 Frog's Hollow. The ochre from the pit was used by the local Aboriginal
 population to decorate themselves during corroborees, for painting and
 decorating didgeridoos which was a valuable trading commodity.
- The Lake Cargelligo Tourist Information Centre houses the unique Alf
 Tyack Stone Butterfly and Gem Collection and is a
 great place to stop for information on Lake Cargelligo and the surrounding
 area providing souvenirs and local art and craft. Call in and visit the
 friendly volunteer staff at the Lake Cargelligo Tourist Information Centre
 at1 Foster Street.
